

**REPORT OF SURVEY VISIT  
DEL MAR COLLEGE  
MULTIPLE ENTRY/EXIT PROGRAM**

**SUMMARY OF REQUEST:**

Consider the report of the survey visit conducted on October 12, 2006 at Del Mar College Multiple Entry-Exit Program (MEEP) in Corpus Christi, Texas and board staff's recommendation for commendations (See Attachment One).

**HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE:**

- The program submitted a proposal for the MEEP which was received in the Board office on June 1, 2006.
- After review of the original proposal, the revised MEEP proposal and several telephone conferences, Board staff visited Del Mar College on June 15, 2006 for the purpose of a face-to-face proposal consultation and a visit to the construction site of the new Health Science Complex.
- The Board granted initial approval status to the MEEP at the July 19-20, 2006 meeting, issued two requirements to be met and authorized board staff to conduct a survey visit in Fall 2006 after construction of the new Health Science Complex was completed.

**PROS AND CONS.:**

Pros:

- Positive findings from the survey visit of the program on October 12, 2006 included the following:  
Strong administrative support exists for the MEEP program.  
The nursing faculty is motivated, creative and committed.  
A state-of-the-art Health Science Complex, including excellent classrooms, faculty offices, and nursing skills labs, is fully equipped with the most current technology and supplies (See Attachment Two).

Cons:

- The program is in the process of addressing the two previous Board-issued requirements related to clinical evaluation tools and the Total Program Evaluation Plan.
- Other Cons: None.
