

**ELIGIBILITY AND DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE REPORT FOR
November 9, 2010**

This report is written to describe E&D Committee actions and trends. There were two (2) Eligibility Requests, eight (8) Requests for Exceptions to a Previous Board Order, one (1) Motion for Rehearing, thirty-nine (39) Disciplinary Agreed Orders, one (1) Reinstatement Agreed Order, four (4) Eligibility Agreed Orders and forty-one (41) Default Revocation Orders.

NATURE OF ELIGIBILITY REQUESTS AND RESOLUTIONS

PETITIONERS: (2)

Denied (2):

1. On or about August 28, 2008, Female Petitioner was arrested for Credit Card Forgery, Credit Card Larceny: take/obtain and Credit Card Fraud by Person.

On or about February 2, 2009, Petitioner was found guilty of Credit Card Forgery, a felony offense committed on July 11, 2008. As a result, Petitioner was sentenced to confinement for a period of two (2) years; however, the imposition of sentence of confinement was suspended and Petitioner was placed on inactive probation for a period of two (2) years. On or about June 24, 2010, Petitioner was discharged from probation.

2. On or about December 21, 2009, Female Petitioner entered a plea of Guilty and was convicted of Trafficking in Counterfeit Computer Documentation and Aiding and Abetting, felony offenses committed on July 28, 2003 through August 26, 2004. As a result of the conviction, Petitioner was placed on probation for a period of five (5) years on each count, to run concurrently. Additionally, Petitioner was ordered to pay a fine and court costs.

Petitioner's treating physician sent a letter to the Board stating that Petitioner has possibly suffered from Bipolar Disorder since her teen years, but was not receptive to the diagnosis until she assumed her care in April 2006. Physician states Petitioner's prognosis is good with continued compliance with her medication regimen. Currently, Petitioner is seen on a monthly basis, with telephone follow-ups at different intervals and her current medications are Lamotrigine 200 mg for mood stabilization and Celexa 20 mg every day for depression and anxiety management and Petitioner is responding well to that regimen, with no medications adjustments for two years.

On or about September 20, 2010, Petitioner was seen by a forensic psychologist to undergo a forensic psychological evaluation. Petitioner was deceptive when responding to questions during the assessment process. Petitioner had a thread of rebellion running through her adolescence, which may have served as the basis for all of her antisocial behavior.

Because Petitioner provided unreliable responses, it appears that there is not enough reliable information on which to recommend that she be licensed. The psychologist stated that he cannot recommend that the Petitioner be licensed, but if the Board was to consider this Petitioner for licensure, it would be wise to require her to participate in counseling designed to alter cognitions that support her past antisocial acting out. Additionally, she should be monitored in the workplace by a supervisor and monitored annually by polygraph exam.
