NATIONAL ISSUES

NCSBN Launches a New Online Course for Member Boards: NCSBN Interactive announces the latest addition to its interactive catalog of self-paced, online courses for continuing education: Governing Responsibly. This course was developed to provide member boards with an introduction to the purpose and work of a BON, and an overview of the responsibilities of a board member. The material was written to assist the new board member transition into his/her role as a BON regulator.

Accredited Schools of Nursing to Receive Federal Funding to Support Veterans with Nursing Education: Last week, Health and Human Services (HHS) Secretary Kathleen Sebelius announced a new program to help military veterans with health care training to build on their skills and abilities, and earn a bachelor's degree in nursing. The program, which will be overseen by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), is set for \$3 million in funding by the end of fiscal year 2013.

Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) Report on U.S. Nursing Workforce Identifies Key Trends: A new report released last week by HRSA regarding the U.S. nursing workforce analyzes the supply, distribution, and educational pipeline of nurses. Data indicate that the nursing workforce grew substantially over the past decade, the percentage of registered nurses holding a bachelor's degree or higher increased and the workforce is gradually becoming more diverse.

Nurses Enrolling in Nursing Programs in Record Numbers: A recent article in the Chicago Tribune reports that in the last five years, the number of students enrolled in baccalaureate nursing programs (BSN) rose by 88 percent across the country. Many attribute this increase to an employer-driven demand for a BSN-educated workforce. To assist in this transition, community colleges and universities are working together to make it easier to transfer college credits and hold remote university-level classes in rural areas, inside hospitals and at community colleges.

Council on State Governments Working Toward Distance Education Compact: The Council of State Governments continues is working with various stakeholders to facilitate the adoption of the State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement, a document that will provide the foundation for a multistate distance education reciprocity compact. Citing a need for more consistent regulatory processes for distance education institutions seeking approval to operate

in multiple states, the agreement lays out a common set of accreditation and regulatory standards and calls for reasonable processes for monitoring authorized institutions and handling complaints.

<u>Doctors and Nurses Charged in Medicare Fraud Bust:</u> In May 2013, federal authorities arrested 89 individuals, including 14 doctors and nurses, suspected of separate Medicare scams that collectively billed approximately \$223 million in fraudulent charges. This massive sting, spanning eight cities, is the latest in a string of federal crack downs on this type of fraud. In recent years, Medicare scams have grown increasingly complex, typically involving recruiters paid to find patients, while doctors, nurses, and other individuals coordinate to appear to deliver medical services to these patients. Federal authorities are in the beginning stages of utilizing an emerging technology that quickly flags suspicious claims before they are paid. http://www.hhs.gov/news/press/2013pres/05/20130514a.html

California Supreme Court Considers Whether Unlicensed Personnel Can Give Insulin to Students: The California Supreme Court recently heard arguments in a case arising from a class-action lawsuit against the state of California schools. The plaintiffs, parents of students with diabetes and the American Diabetes Association, brought this action regarding the requirement for administration of insulin to a student by a licensed nurse within the public school setting to court. The plaintiffs argue that the current shortage of school nurses in the state makes this requirement untenable and puts children at risk. The California Nurses Association argues that, under the existing California Nurse Practice Act, unlicensed persons cannot perform the functions of a nurse, including treatments that require substantial scientific knowledge and technical skill. The law lists administration of medication as a nursing function. The California Court of Appeals previously held that, while school personnel are permitted to assist students with medication according to the state education code, this assistance shall not include administering the medication. The Supreme Court now must reconcile the nursing law with the state education code.

Patterns in Medicare Part D: This month, the OIG released a study based on an analysis of Prescription Drug Event records to identify prescribers that may warrant further scrutiny based on questionable prescribing patterns. While many of the findings focused exclusively on the prescribing patterns of general-care physicians, the study also looked, to an extent, at nurse practitioners (NPs). NPs represented 6.5 percent of prescribers and were responsible for 3.4 percent of all Part D prescriptions. The OIG concluded that study findings indicated a need for increased oversight of Part D, prompting them to make recommendations for further steps to be taken by Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). CMS concurred with these recommendations and demonstrated a commitment to addressing the issue, including support of active monitoring of prescribing patterns; education for prescribers about overutilization of prescription drugs; and a willingness to follow up on prescribing patterns likely of fraud and abuse. http://oig.hhs.gov/oei/reports/oei-02-09-00603.pdf

STATE ISSUES

<u>Health Professions Council:</u> The Health Professions Council (HPC) met on June 10, 2013 for its regular quarterly meeting. The Council discussed various legislation that passed in the 83rd Legislative Session and impact on health professions boards. Members received reports on the budget and information technology services provided to agencies by HPC staff.

<u>BON Bulletin Articles</u>: The April issue of the *Board of Nursing Bulletin* contains: 1.) article on nursing legislation that passed in the 83rd Legislative Session affecting nursing regulation; 2.) article on the Academic Progression in Nursing (APIN) initiative; 3.) FAQs on RN Delegation in Independent Living Environments; and 4.) TPAPN Advocates.

Board Development: Board Development at the July Board meeting will be on the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF) Academic Progression in Nursing (APIN) initiative. APIN's purpose is to support state and regional strategies to develop higher levels of education among the nursing workforce. Texas is a recipient of one of the nine state grants that will focus on advancing the recommendation in the Institute of Medicine report, *The Future of Nursing: Leading Change, Advancing Health*, that 80 percent of the nursing workforce be prepared at the baccalaureate level by 2020.

Former Board President to Receive NCSBN Award: Dr. Linda Rounds, former Board Member and President of the Texas Board of Nursing, has been selected to receive the NCSBN Elaine Ellibee Award. This is a new award that is named in honor of the first President of NCSBN. Ms. Ellibee passed away November 17, 2012. The award will be presented to Dr. Rounds at the August 2013 Delegate Assembly and Annual Meeting in Providence, R.I.

AGENCY ISSUES

<u>Staff</u>: An article by Jolene Zych, PhD, RN and Linda Rounds, PhD, RN was recently published in the online version of *the Journal of the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners* titled: "The Consensus Model for APRN Regulation: Implications for Nurse Practitioners.

Nursing Jurisprudence Examination: The Jurisprudence examination required for initial licensure by Texas Occupations Code Section 301.252, License Application, was implemented in September 2008. Access to the Board's examination is available through the website, http://www.bon.state.tx.us/olv/je.html. Those applying for initial licensure by exam or endorsement after September 1, 2008 must pass the Jurisprudence Exam in order to be eligible for licensure. Also, pursuant to recent rule amendments, nurses who have not been current in Texas for four or more years, must complete the Jurisprudence Examination prior to reinstatement. Attached are statistics for Jurisprudence exam takers for past 3 fiscal years including through the third quarter of Fiscal Year 2013. (See Attachment A).

Staff continue to study the issue of increasing security of the examination. Staff is exploring adding security validation questions to the exam and are evaluating associated costs with vendors.

National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) Projects: Phase Two of the Data Integrity Project began in June 2012. This phase includes uploading disciplinary orders to Nursys, making these orders readily available to other Boards of Nursing. This project will be completed by July 31, 2013. Staff will seek approval for a new project to scan all declaratory orders into our laserfiche electronic storage system.

Information Technology Updates: Staff are currently addressing several recommendations made in the Roadmap recommended by the IT Security Assessment performed by Gartner, Inc. (reported to the Board, April 2012). In addition, staff are implementing a three phase Disaster Recovery / Virtualization Project (DRVP). Development of a secondary site for disaster recovery will ensure that our mission critical services can be seamlessly continued in the event of a disaster. A new IT infrastructure will be needed to adapt to this new model. Phase I will

include changing the current IT infrastructure to a virtualized system. Servers will be consolidated into smaller servers; and the secondary server will mirror the main server so that if one fails, the other can immediately be brought up and avoid any interruption in service. In Phase II, the remote disaster recovery site will be set up with back up of all BON data files, enabling activation of services to our constituents in the event of any natural or man-made disaster. Implementation of Phase III will be virtualization of all BON desktop computers. This will allow users to have access to all programs from any device or location and management of security and group policies will be more efficient. Phase I will be implemented in the current fiscal year. Phases II and III will be implemented in FY 2014 as funds permit. Finally, staff are reviewing the current website and planning a complete redesign of the site.
