

**ELIGIBILITY AND DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE REPORT FOR
September 10, 2019 and November 12, 2019**

The Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee (Committee) convened on September 10, 2019 and November 12, 2019. This report collectively summarizes the matters and decisions made at the time of the meeting¹.

Petitioners for Licensure

No petitions for licensure were considered by the Committee.

Petitioners for an Exception to a Previous Board Order

The Committee considered eleven (11) petitions for an exception to a previous board order:

1. Petitioner requested an Exception to a previous Board Order dated October 25, 2018, requesting to be allowed to work in home health. It was the Committee's decision to deny the request.
2. Petitioner requested an Exception to a previous Board Order dated October 27, 2016, requesting to be allowed to work in home health or to be supervised by a physician or a physician assistant. It was the Committee's decision to deny the request to work in home health and grant the request to be supervised by a physician or a physician assistant.
3. Petitioner requested an Exception to a previous Board Order dated August 14, 2018, requesting an unencumbered license. It was the Committee's decision to deny the request.
4. Petitioner requested an Exception to a previous Board Order dated February 10, 2015, requesting an unencumbered license. It was the Committee's decision to deny the request.
5. Petitioner requested an Exception to a previous Board Order dated September 13, 2017, requesting an unencumbered license. It was the Committee's decision to deny the request.
6. Petitioner requested an Exception to a previous Board Order dated April 19, 2018, requesting an unencumbered license. It was the Committee's decision to deny the request.

7. Petitioner requested an Exception to a previous Board Order dated June 14, 2016, requesting an unencumbered license. It was the Committee's decision to deny the request for an unencumbered license and grant the supervision stipulation to be replaced with incident reporting and continue required random drug screening, support groups, and nurse performance evaluations.
8. Petitioner requested an Exception to a previous Board Order dated October 27, 2016, requesting restoration of her prescriptive authority. It was the Committee's decision to deny the request.
9. Petitioner requested an Exception to a previous Board Order dated October 25, 2018, requesting to be allowed to work for Monte Cristo Health Care, Inc. in El Paso, Texas. It was the Committee's decision to continue the exception for Executive Director's final approval of the letter from Monte Cristo Health Care's Director of Nursing explaining supervision.
10. Petitioner requested an Exception to a previous Board Order dated June 1, 2016, requesting an unencumbered license. It was the Committee's decision to grant the request.
11. Petitioner requested an Exception to a previous Board Order dated July 19, 2018, requesting to be allowed to work for a private nursing facility (similar to Home Health) and that the two years of probation be reduced to six months. It was the Committee's decision to continue the request for Executive Director's final approval of appropriate documentation that outlines the supervisory requirement and the role of physicians at the Restoria Retreat clinic where she is seeking employment.

Motions for Rehearing

No motions for rehearing were considered by the Committee.

Orders Ratified:

Ninety-three (93) disciplinary agreed orders were approved.

Nine (9) reinstatement agreed orders were approved.

Three (3) eligibility agreed orders were approved.

Forty (40) default revocation orders were approved.

One (1) deferred disciplinary action agreed orders were approved.

Six (6) KSTAR Pilot Program agreed orders were approved.
