

**ELIGIBILITY AND DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE REPORT FOR
December 10, 2019 and February 11, 2020**

The Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee (Committee) convened on December 10, 2019 and February 11, 2020. This report collectively summarizes the matters and decisions made at the time of the meeting¹.

Petitioners for Licensure

1 petition for licensure were considered by the Committee.

1. The committee met to review the material submitted by Petitioner and Staff. The Committee discussed the events leading up to the Petition for Declaratory Order filed by Petitioner. The Committee voted to grant the petitioner eligibility with a Confidential Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses Order and stipulations.

Petitioners for an Exception to a Previous Board Order

The Committee considered eleven (13) petitions for an exception to a previous board order:

1. The Committee met to review the material submitted by Petitioner and Staff. Petitioner requested an Exception to a previous Board Order dated October 26, 2017, requesting to be allowed to work for multiple employers in nursing. It was the Committee's decision to continue the request for the final decision to be made at the discretion of the Executive Director pending submission of job description from the second employer/position.
2. The Committee met to review the material submitted by Petitioner and Staff. Petitioner requested an Exception to a previous Board Order dated October 25, 2017, requesting that her participation in Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses (TPAPN) be referred to the New Jersey Board of Nursing's Recovery and Monitoring Program (RAMP) or an unencumbered license. It was the Committee's decision to grant the request allowing New Jersey's RAMP program to continue monitoring in compliance the petitioners' TPAPN Board Order and deny an unencumbered license.
3. The Committee met to review the material submitted by Petitioner and Staff. Petitioner requested an Exception to a previous Board Order dated October 25, 2018, requesting an unencumbered license. It was the Committee's decision to grant a modification allowing incident reporting for the remainder of the Order.
4. The Committee met to review the material submitted by Petitioner and Staff. Petitioner requested an Exception to a previous Board Order dated November 20, 2017, requesting early release from Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses. It was the Committee's decision to grant the request.
