

Texas Team Report - Robert Wood Johnson Initiative

Summary of Request:

The purpose of this report is to provide the Board with an update on the current status of the Education subcommittee of the Texas Team's Initiative on the Future of Nursing.

Historical Perspective:

The Texas Team Action Coalition is a part of the Future of Nursing: *Campaign for Action*, a joint initiative of AARP and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. The Campaign is working to transform health care through nursing.

The Texas Team is led by a Strategic Advisory Council and Executive Committee. In February 2018, Texas Team reorganized its work groups around specific strategic goals:

1. Facilitate the preparation of faculty to meet the workforce demands of the future (transition to faculty roles).
2. Facilitate the transition to practice for new graduate RNs and ARPNs.
3. Support and advance nurses leading from the bedside.
4. Advance nurses on boards.

The Education Committee of the Texas Team meets monthly and is working toward the following sub-goals of the Texas Team:

1. Create a repository of interactions (e.g. Toolkit) for transition from clinical to educator roles.
2. Conduct a study, including statistics and collected data, of transition from clinical practice to educator roles.
3. Disseminate findings (e.g. white papers, conference presentations).

Since the September meeting, it was announced that the Texas Team Education Committee would be holding its final meeting in November and sunset the committee. Minutes from the final teleconference meeting of the Education Committee on November 18, 2020 are provided below:
