# Texas Board of Nursing Bulletin

The mission of the Texas Board of Nursing is to protect and promote the welfare of the people of Texas by ensuring that each person holding a license as a nurse in the State of Texas is competent to practice safely. The Board fulfills its mission through the regulation of the practice of nursing and the approval of nursing education programs. This mission, derived from the Nursing Practice Act, supersedes the interest of any individual, the nursing profession, or any special interest group.

## New and Updated Continuing Nursing Education Requirements

**New Requirement: Nursing Jurisprudence and Ethics** – all nurses are required to complete at least two contact hours in nursing jurisprudence and ethics prior to the end of every third licensure renewal cycle. The contact hours must be approved as continuing nursing education (CNE). This requirement cannot be met through an approved national nursing certification. Rule 216, related to Continuing Competency, was amended to reflect the new requirements and became effective February 23, 2014. The content must include information about the Texas Nursing Practice Act; the Texas Board of Nursing (BON) rules, including Board Rule 217.11; Standards of Nursing Practice; the Texas BON Position Statements; principles of nursing ethics; and professional boundaries.

**New Requirement: Geriatric Care or Older Adult** – all nurses who provide nursing care to any patient or patients who are older adults must complete at least two contact hours related to the older adult or geriatric care every licensure renewal cycle. The content must include information about elder abuse, age related memory changes and disease processes, including chronic conditions, and end of life issues. Other content, such as information related to health maintenance and health promotion of the older adult or geriatric populations, may be included.

**Effective Dates** - each of the above requirements will become effective with licensure renewal cycles that start after January 1, 2014. For example, in relation to the nursing jurisprudence and ethics requirement, if your license expires in May 2014, you do not have to complete a nursing jurisprudence and ethics course between now and May 31, 2014. However, you will be required to complete at least two contact hours in nursing jurisprudence and ethics between June 1, 2014 and May 31, 2020, again between June 1, 2020 and May 31, 2026, and continue to comply with the requirement before the end of every third two-year licensing cycle. If your practice includes care of geriatric pa-

tients or older adults and if your license expires in January of 2015, this requirement begins with the licensure cycle February 1, 2015 to January 31, 2017 and continues in every licensure cycle thereafter. The geriatric requirement may be met either through contact hours or through an approved national nursing geriatric certification (an example of an approved certification includes the American Nurses Credentialing Center's Gerontological Nurse certification). An advanced practice registered nurse may use continuing medical education to meet this requirement.

**Updated Forensic Evidence Collection Requirement** – all nurses who perform a forensic examination on a sexual assault survivor in any practice setting must have basic forensic evidence collection training or the equivalent education before performing the examination. The requirement for nurses who work in an emergency department to complete at least two contact hours related to forensic evidence collection within two years of the initial date of employment in an emergency department remains in Board Rule. The updated rule requires completion of forensic education *prior* to performing a

performing a forensic examination. While this is a one-time requirement, nurses who may be asked to perform a forensic examination may wish to complete education at regular intervals to keep their knowledge current.

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### Texas TERCAP Mid-Pilot Report reviewed during January Board Meeting

A report concerning the Texas Taxonomy of Error Root Cause Analysis of Practice-responsibility (TERCAP) Pilot Program was reviewed with the Texas Board of Nursing (BON) during its January 24 meeting in Austin, Texas. The pilot began in September 2012 and goes through August 2014.

The initial TERCAP Project was developed and implemented for state boards of nursing by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) and provides consistent national data about practice breakdown that NCSBN trends and reports nationally. Because of the success of NCSBN's Project, the BON chose that organization's TERCAP® Instrument as the error classification system for a pilot program for utilization by Texas peer review committees. Letters inviting participation in the pilot were distributed to hospitals around the state. Responses were favorable and approximately 200 nurses, representing peer review committees from 50 hospital systems and 95 individual hospitals, participated in training workshops during the summer of 2012 in Austin, Houston, and the Dallas/Ft. Worth area.

The BON believes that this pilot program will assist peer review committees in recognizing and highlighting factors involved in nursing practice breakdown incidents and will promote a better understanding of the etiology of nursing practice errors. Further, evaluating causative factors and developing methods to mitigate nursing practice errors should facilitate a proactive approach in promoting patient safety; an approach that the BON believes is important in fulfilling its mission to protect the public. Pilot objectives are to:

- advance patient safety by analyzing incidents of nursing practice breakdown,
- evaluate factors surrounding error events to facilitate an understanding of the etiology of nursing errors,
- promote the development of methods to mitigate those errors, and
- create a peer review environment that is transparent, positive, and supportive of this error analysis effort.

The pilot calls for nursing peer review committees to enter nursing practice breakdown incidents into the TERCAP state-wide online data base. The practice breakdown incidents appropriate for the pilot are those cases that a nursing peer review committee has reviewed and determined are not required to be reported to the BON. This includes minor incidents which are events that indicate the nurse's continued practice does not pose a risk of harm to patients or other persons; or when remediation is reasonably expected to adequately mitigate any risk and the nurse successfully completes the remediation.

A mid-pilot report was developed to share preliminary trends and observations during the first year of the pilot. Though the findings are tentative and will not be finalized until the pilot is completed in August, a review of descriptive data and trends are outlined in the report. Some of the findings reflect that the majority of nurses involved in the practice breakdown were seasoned employees who had worked on the patient care unit for over five years and were not working in a temporary capacity. Additionally, the majority of nurses did not have a history and/or pattern of practice breakdown and were retained by their employer. In regards to the system issues found in conjunction with nursing practice breakdown, communication system factors were the most frequently cited.

Another finding is that the Texas TERCAP Pilot Program is very integral to an institution's existing peer review process. The inter-relatedness of these processes in promoting patient safety and improving quality nursing care is one that merits more analysis and staff will be reviewing this information throughout the next year.

## Summary of Actions

A regular meeting of the Board of Nursing was held January 23-24, 2014, in Austin. The following is a summary of Board actions taken during this meeting.



In the February 14, 2014 issue of the *Texas Register*, the Texas Board of Nursing (Board) published as adopted amendments to Chapter 216, §§216.1 - 216.3 and §§216.5 - 216.11, concerning *Continuing Competency*. The amendments were adopted without changes to the proposed text as published in the December 6, 2013, issue of the *Texas Register* (38 TexReg 8742). The amendments to Chapter 216 were necessary to implement the requirements of Senate Bill (SB) 1058 and SB 1191, both enacted by the 83rd Texas Legislature, Regular Session, and effective September 1, 2013. The adopted amendments amended the definition of the term "advanced practice registered nurse" for consistency with the Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Consensus Model of the National Council of State Boards of Nursing, corrected outdated references and minor typographical errors in the rule text, and replaced the term "continuing education" with "continuing nursing education", as appropriate throughout the rule text. The amendments became effective February 23, 2014.

Also appearing in the February 14, 2014 issue of the *Texas Register*, the

Board adopted new Chapter 228, §228.1, concerning *Pain Management*. The new chapter was adopted without changes to the proposed text as published in the December 6, 2013, issue of the *Texas Register* (38 TexReg 8750). The new section prescribes the minimum standards of nursing practice for an advanced practice registered nurse (APRN) who provides pain management services. The new chapter became effective February 23, 2014.

In the February 21, 2014 issue of the *Texas Register*, the Board published as adopted amendments to Chapter 225 which amended §§225.1 - 225.6, §§225.8 - 225.11, and new §§225.12 - 225.15, concerning *RN Delegation to Unlicensed Personnel and Tasks Not Requiring Delegation in Independent Living Environments for Clients with Stable and Predictable Conditions*. Sections 225.8, 225.10, and 225.15 were adopted with changes to the proposed text published in the November 22, 2013, issue of the *Texas Register* (38 TexReg 8352). Sections 225.1 - 225.6, 225.9, 225.11, and 225.12 - 225.14 were adopted without changes to the proposed text as published. The amendments to Chap-

ter 225 became effective February 24, 2014.

In the February 28, 2014 issue of the *Texas Register*, the Board proposed new Chapter 227, pertaining to *Pilot Programs for Innovative Applications to Vocational and Professional Nursing Education*, §§227.1 -227.4 simultaneous with repeal of existing Chapter 227, §§227.1 -227.6, concerning *Pilot Programs for Innovative Applications to Professional Nursing Education*. The proposed new chapter establishes the procedures and requirements that apply to pilot programs for innovative applications to vocational and professional nursing education. New Chapter 227 reorganizes the provisions of the chapter, applies the provisions of the chapter to both professional and vocational nursing education programs, and establishes the requirements and procedures that will apply to pilot programs for innovative applications to professional and vocational nursing education. The earliest date of adoption for proposed repeal of §§227.1 -227.6 and adoption of new §§227.1 -227.4 is March 30, 2014.

## Nurses on Guard: Patient Safety through Hand Hygiene

Good hand hygiene aligns with the standards of nursing practice as nurses have a vital role in preventing exposure to infectious pathogens that potentially contribute to healthcare acquired infections and thus promote patient safety. From hand washing with soap and water to hand hygiene including hand sanitizers and alcohol-based hand gels and rubs, the options related to hand hygiene have changed over time. Patient safety organizations have identified hand hygiene as a vital component of safe patient care.

In the nineteenth century, Florence Nightingale encouraged frequent hand washing using soap and water as part of promoting cleanliness. Infections in patients and spread of contagious conditions continued to be a significant risk for patients into the twentieth century and are still an issue today. Over time, the interventions related to combating infections have evolved, and infection control practices and policies have emerged to become an area of specialization.

Organizations, such as the World Health Organization (WHO) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), have issued and updated guidelines related to hand hygiene. Accreditation organizations, such as the Joint Commission (TJC), also have patient safety standards or National Patient Safety Goals (NPSG) related to hand hygiene.

The CDC Guidelines related to hand hygiene include information related to hand hygiene products and practices and provide recommendations for healthcare workers, including nurses, who provide care to patients in a variety of healthcare settings. As various hand hygiene products are studied, some are found to be more effective at decreasing the presence of certain pathogens, but not as effective with other pathogens. Some products provide protection against pathogens for a longer time period than others. For example, alcohol-based products are more effective for standard hand washing/hand antisepsis than soap or antimicrobial soap and water for healthcare workers since alcohol based

products decrease bacterial counts more than either soap or antimicrobial soap and water (CDC, 2002, p. 11). However, nothing is more effective at ridding healthcare workers' hands of spore forming bacteria than hand washing with soap (either antimicrobial or non-antimicrobial) and water (CDC, 2002, p. 17).

When hand hygiene products are tested for efficacy in research conditions, the circumstances differ from actual usage of hand hygiene products by healthcare workers. According to the CDC, the average healthcare worker spends less than 15 seconds on average performing hand hygiene (CDC, 2002, p. 8). This amount of time may not be long enough for many hand hygiene products to succeed in decreasing the risk of spreading pathogens from the healthcare worker's hands to the next patient or environmental object contacted.

Many healthcare organizations are accredited by an organization such as TJC. Hand hygiene has been identified as one of TJC's national patient safety goals. Hand hygiene, including guidance from either the CDC or the WHO, is a cornerstone of infection prevention and incorporated into TJC accreditation standards. To encourage compliance with hand hygiene, TJC has a variety of materials, such as patient videos, wall posters, and wearable buttons that include messages or information related to hand hygiene.

Nurses have an essential role in promoting patient safety and preventing the spread of communicable conditions. Good hand hygiene is one important safety step that may accomplish both patient safety and decrease the incidence of healthcare acquired infectious conditions. The many factors leading to decreased adherence to hand hygiene recommendations include environmental factors, such as access to hand hygiene products, skin irritation of the healthcare worker, and factors that impact the stress placed on healthcare workers, such as a high acuity patient assignment and short staffing (CDC,

2002, p. 24). Nurses have an obligation to actively intervene to ensure patient safety and this responsibility is further explained in Position Statement 15.14, *Duty of a Nurse in any Practice Setting*. Board Rule 217.11, *Standards of Nursing Practice*, sets the minimum standards that all nurses must meet including preventing patient exposure to infections and communicable conditions.

Both hand washing with soap and water and using alcohol-based hand hygiene products are essential components of good hand hygiene (Vinson and Thomas, 2011, p. 18). TJC has identified hand hygiene as an essential component related to prevention of infection through the NPSG. Through proper hand hygiene nurses can fulfill their role as patient advocates in preventing healthcare acquired infections.

## Position Statements with Substantive Changes for 2014: A Brief Overview

In January of each year, the Texas Board of Nursing (Board) reviews Board position statements for accuracy and relevance to ensure appropriate guidance related to nursing education and practice. This year, several Position Statements had substantive changes. An overview of the substantive changes to position statements that were adopted by the Board is provided below:

Position Statement 15.2, *The Role of the Licensed Vocational Nurse in the Pronouncement of Death*, has additional irreversible signs of death listed. This addition is in alignment with information from the American Heart Association and the Frequently Asked Question (FAQ) - Initiation of CPR - A Nurse's Duty to Initiate.

Position Statement 15.6, *Board Rules Associated with Alleged Patient "Abandonment"*, has a new section under the heading *Emergency Preparedness and Workplace Violence* to provide guidance to nurses in the event of emergencies (including disasters, infectious disease outbreaks, or bioterrorism), or a violent situation in the workplace (such as with an active shooter).

Position Statement 15.8, *Role of the Nurse in Moderate Sedation*, contains

new information related to the use of a US FDA approved computer-assisted personalized sedation system in accordance with specific approval parameters, including appropriate training and availability of anesthesia providers, should an emergency arise. A nurse is required to complete training prior to using any computer-assisted personalized sedation system. As in all situations, when a nurse has a question about his or her scope of practice or is uncertain about new procedures or new technology, the nurse is encouraged to use the Board's Six-Step Decision-Making Model for Determining Nursing Scope of Practice.

Position Statement 15.15, *Board's Jurisdiction Over a Nurse's Practice in Any Role and Use of the Nursing Title*, reflects amendments to the Nursing Practice Act [Section 301.004(a)(5)] as a result of Senate Bill (S.B.) 1058 of the 83rd Regular Session of the Texas Legislature in 2013.

Position Statement 15.18, *Nurses Carrying out Orders from Advanced Practice Registered Nurses*, has substantive changes to reflect S.B. 406 of the 83rd Regular Session of the Texas Legislature in 2013 regarding

prescriptive authority under the delegated authority of a physician and references prescriptive authority agreements throughout the position statement.

Position Statement 15.22, *APRNs Providing Medical Aspects of Care for Individuals with Whom There is a Close Personal Relationship*, reflects the new changes to Chapter 222, relating to *Advanced Practice Registered Nurses with Prescriptive Authority*. This includes a change to the title of the position statement as well as references to specific rule sections within Chapter 222 and explanatory language to guide the APRN.

## TPAPN Adopts Evidence-Based Recommendations

The Texas Peer Assistance Program for Nurses (TPAPN) is the only standardized recovery program recognized by the Texas Board of Nursing, in which nurses are referred for treatment of substance use disorders or certain psychiatric disorders. In 2011, the National Council of State Boards of Nursing put forth evidence-based recommendations for alternative to discipline programs, such as TPAPN. While Texas required two years of participation for licensed vocational nurses (LVNs) and registered nurses (RNs), and three years for advanced practice registered nurses (APRNs), approximately 44 other states have similar Board-approved alternative programs for nurses requiring participation for a minimum of three years. Skipper and DuPont (2013) have reported that an increased length of monitoring is associated with positive behavioral changes for

recovery. In light of evidence showing that extended participation is consistent with better outcomes, TPAPN has added an additional year of participation to the recovery program for LVNs and RNs and an additional two years for APRNs.

TPAPN has also implemented changes designed to enhance participation and reduce the burden to employers. Some of the changes that may increase participation by nurses include the possibility of continuing nursing practice upon entry into the TPAPN program, the potential to accept a night shift nursing position, and less delay in returning to work if the nurse has a short term prescribed controlled substance due to a medical condition. To decrease the burden to employers, changes to the TPAPN program include flexibility in the required number of work monitors and decreased frequency of meetings with the supervisor.


### Is there a single event that inspired you to pursue the position with the Board or the profession of nursing?

**Statistical information: Notice of Disciplinary Action**

The 524 disciplinary actions reported in this bulletin represent only 0.151% of all nurses who are currently licensed to practice in the State of Texas.
